

Washington Hall claims 640 acres of land in Lewis County, situated and bounded as follows To wit. Commencing at a stake at Common tide water mark of the Pacific Ocean, it being the W side of Chenook plain and W of a grove of dead timber, which stands on a ridge of said plain, and W of a green grove of timber on the E side of a body of water near the E side of said plain & also on the sea coast between Cape Disappointment & Shoal water Bay. Thence run S 640 rods with the meanders of the beach to a stake marked, thence E 160 rods to a stake, thence N parallel with the first line 640 rods to a stake, thence W 160 rods to the place of beginning
